## BEST DEMO AWARD RESULTS

The selection process for the BEST DEMO AWARD comprised two parts:

A: Total score given by the two-member Selection Jury (using a 1-3-5 point scale for the best three demos).

B: Total sum of points given by participants (using a 1-3-5 point scale for the best three demos).

The members of the jury were:

**Denis Gillet** from Swiss Federal Institute of Technology in Lausanne, Switzerland;

**Zorica Nedic** from University of South Australia, Australia.

The jury evaluated each according to the following criteria: suitability of topic to the call, quality of the product in regards to its targeted audience, quality of presentation, technical correctness and completeness, online availability and possibility of reuse at home and at school or workplace and innovation.

The participants, excluding authors and co-authors of the demos presented, were also free of evaluating, too.

The final result has been defined by the average coming from components A and B.
